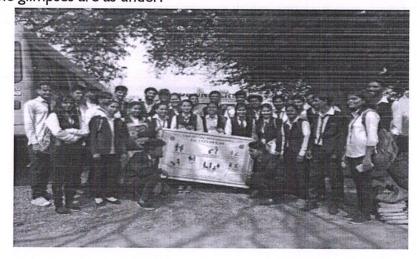

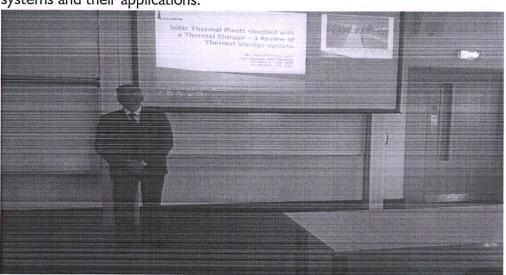

(m) Green Initiatives taken by University:

Alternate Energy Initiatives: 100 kW Solar PV Plant- Roof mounted & grid connected for Net Metering:

- a. SOLAR PV first to start Net Metering on HT in Madhya Pradesh
- RKDF University installed it's 100 kW Solar PV Roof Top plant in April 2015
- It has generated over 4.5 Lac Units (kWh) in last 3 years
- RKDF University is first to start Net Metering on HT in Madhya Pradesh on 20th March 2018
- Averted over 400 Tons CO2 in three years, (Equivalent to 8,000 trees and allowed them to grow for 10 years)

b. SOLAR THERMAL PILOT PROJECTS

• In addition to above the University has pioneered in setting up of a latest technology of Solar Thermal using innovative halide salt in collaboration with RPI- USA. This completed project was sponsored by MNRE, Govt. of India (July 2015 to June 2017). The next phase of the project of 40 kW size has also got in-principal approval from Govt. of India and the project is being taken-up shortly.

(n) WASTE MANAGEMENT

 Solid waste management: Two bin system followed- Green & Blue for food & Recyclable waste respectively

- Liquid waste management: STP (250 KLD+ 100 KLD) & ETP (50 KLD) for Sewage and Effluent treatment respectively are operational as detailed below:
 - 350 KLD sewage treatment plant Consisting of 250 KLD sewage treatment plant + 100 KLD sewage treatment plant
- E-Waste Management: Since the University is only 5 Years old, E- Waste is not being produced at present however a research group in electronics and computer science department is working to identify variable and suitable techniques of E- waste disposal, E waste utilization & Recycling.

(o) GREEN CAMPUS

The University has developed garden in total area 63,000 Sq. ft. adjacent to 28 Buildings and 10 garden patches at important locations like admin building, Main Gate, Hostels & near Solar energy Park and canteen etc.
